P: Alleluia! Christ is risen!

C: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

CHOIR: "Hallelujah! Resurrection Day"/"A Reason for Singing"

EASTER PROCLAMATION

- P: Rejoice, now, all heavenly choirs of angels, and celebrate the divine mysteries with exultation; and, for the victory of so great a King, sound the trumpet of salvation!
- C: Exult also, O earth, enlightened with such radiance; and, made brilliant by the splendor of the Eternal King, know that the ancient darkness has been banished from all the world!
- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C: It is right to give him thanks and praise.
- P: It is indeed right and salutary that we should with full devotion of heart, and mind, and voice praise the invisible God, the Father almighty, and his only Son, our living Lord Jesus Christ:

Who paid for us the debt of Adam to the eternal Father, and who by his precious blood redeemed us from the bondage to ancient sin. For this indeed is the Paschal Feast in which the true Lamb is slain, by whose blood the doorposts of the faithful are made holy.

- P: This is the morning we celebrate your deliverance of our forebears, the children of Israel, from the land of Egypt and led them dry-shod through the Red Sea.
- C: This is the morning we celebrate your saving all who believe in Christ from the gloom of hell; this morning, all of creation is renewed in grace and holiness by the rising brightness of your Son, Jesus Christ!
- P: This is the morning we celebrate your Son Jesus Christ, our living Lord, who took our sins upon himself, who broke the chains of death and who arose from hell in triumph!
- C: O blessed morning, whose first light shined on the newly resurrected Lord!
 O blessed morning, in which heaven and earth are joined—things human and things divine!
- P: We, therefore pray to you, O Lord, in whose honor this Paschal candle burns, that you will continue to vanquish the darkness of night and faithfully shed light on the whole human race.

(The Paschal candle, which represents Christ's presence among us, is lit)

C: O Christ, you are the Bright Morning Star, which never sets! You are the Bright Morning Star, who rose from the grave and crushed darkness forever! Vanquish the darkness of our souls, and shine radiantly in our hearts!

(Please rise)

- P: O, how infinite the goodness of your love, that to redeem a slave, you delivered your Son!
- C: O necessary sin of Adam, that is wiped away by the death of Christ!
- P: O, how wonderful your lovingkindness!
- C: O happy fault that was worthy to have so great a Redeemer!

- P: O blessed morning!
- C: O blessed morning!
- P: Be glad, O mother Church, clothed with the brightness of such a light, and let this house resound with the triumphant voices of the peoples:
- C: Alleluia! Alleluia! Christ is risen! Alleluia!
- P: We pray all these things through the same Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, fully God yet fully human, who has crushed hell, who has destroyed the devil, who has won life for all people and who now lives and rules with you, O holy Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Isaiah 65:17—25

L: A reading from Isaiah.

For I am about to create new heavens

and a new earth;

the former things shall not be remembered

or come to mind.

But be glad and rejoice forever

in what I am creating; for I am about to create

Jerusalem as a joy,

and its people as a delight.

I will rejoice in Jerusalem,

and delight in my people;

no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it,

or the cry of distress.

No more shall there be in it

an infant that lives but a few days,

or an old person who does not live out a lifetime;

for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed.

They shall build houses and inhabit them:

they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit.

They shall not build and another inhabit;

they shall not plant and another eat;

for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be,

and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. They shall not labor in vain, or bear children for calamity; for they shall be offspring blessed by the LORD—and their descendants as well.

Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear.

The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, the lion shall eat straw like the ox; but the serpent--its food shall be dust!

They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the LORD.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:19—26

L: A reading from 1 Corinthians.

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that "the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.
