Pastor Writes

I write this on a Tuesday morning, only days after my first-ever sick Sunday. Ever since I began serving this parish, I always wondered what would happen if I happened to get sick on a Sunday morning. Through the years, I have managed to navigate through three successful pregnancies and one lost one, and dozens of rounds of flu, strep throat, pink eye, bronchitis, etc, but always managed to dodge the bullet on a Sunday morning. My worry was always rooted in the fact that, in our rural community, last-minute substitute pastors are nearly impossible to come by, and so what would happen should I get sick on a Sunday like Easter? Or on a Sunday when a baptism is scheduled?

Well, this past Sunday I discovered exactly what would happen.

After flopping around on the bathroom floor during the wee hours of Sunday morning and praying for death (due to what I now believe was food poisoning) and feebly texting between bouts of nausea, the synod found a substitute pastor who was able and willing to drive from Williamsburg to preside over the second service, where a double baptism was to take place. My eternal thanks to Pastor Gloria Dovre. And my eternal thanks to Dan Burke for leading Our Savior's in the Service of the Word.

Feeling relieved that the services were well in-hand, I drifted off to sleep...still on the bathroom floor. Sometime around 6:30, Philip stumbled half-asleep into the bathroom, saw me on the floor and shouted at the top of his lungs, "HEY! MOM'S DEAD!" This jolted me awake and brought the other two boys running helter-skelter into the bathroom, where they discovered a not-dead mom, but rather just a mom who looked like deathwarmed-over. They described me as "yucky looking."

As the day progressed, I felt better, but weak, and so I did absolutely nothing. Nothing. Except I messed around on the computer. Laid in bed and read a little. Watched a little TV. Later in the afternoon, the boys wanted to watch a movie, and I curled up in the recliner with a blanket and they all three sat on me and around me. They looked at me quizzically from time to time and once even asked, "Don't you have something to do?"

"No," I replied, "I am just going to watch this movie with you guys."

"Aren't you going to fold laundry?"

"No."

"Aren't you going to return phone calls?"

"No."

"Aren't you going to look through the mail?"

"No."

"So....you're just gonna watch this movie with us?"

"Yes."

"Hey, mom...we like it when you're sick." I thought about that as the jungle animals of Madagascar did their thing. And I will admit to you, it was bliss. I never, ever just sit and watch *anything* with them. I am always doing something else at the same time, often offering an absent-minded *mmm-hmm* when they point out something extra funny. It took a nasty stomach bug to knock me out, to slow me down, to rest, to sit, to snuggle, to simply watch and laugh with them.

Our children don't like it when we're sick! But they like it when we slow down enough to see the world through their eyes for just a little bit, to really laugh at the things they think are funny, to enter their world for a bit, even as we insist they enter ours all too often. I do not think God caused (Continued on next page)

my stomach to turn on me in order for me to slow down. But I do think God used that time as an opportunity for me to see the Sabbath for what God intended it to be—a time to find my tiny niche within his created order and spend time with my sons...a tender and rare time to snuggle together under a blanket and watch a funny movie, maybe not feeling all that great, but certainly not dead (yet!), just *resting*.



- ➤ A donation of \$50 was given to the After-Prom event:
- > Shelton and Bousselot will meet with Joyce Sands for a scheduled review of church cleaning;
- > Tracy Gasper will design a landscaping plan for the berm and submit a cost estimate;
- ➤ Driveway repair cost will be shared by Faith Church and the town of Calamus;
- Four cracked panes of glass above the front entry doors will be replaced by the original installer; the light-blocking film will be removed from the interior surface; Gasper will research the cost of installing stained glass on the interior of these windows.

Graduating from High School



Thoughts for Memorial Day



In his speech at Gettysburg, Abraham Lincoln's words focused on the loss of life during the Civil War and the higher cause for which the lives were given, but they ring true as a reminder for today... that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion...that this nation under God shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people....should not perish from this earth.

Lincoln's charge was to ensure that the cause to which each soldier gave their life would not be lost, and that this Union, which he himself had given an oath to preserve, protect and defend, would grow ever stronger.

And when you've carefully examined every feature of that soldier's face, stand up straight and tall and smile your best smile. Thank that soldier, because it does what some cannot or will not. It defends what it believes to be right with it's very life. But more important, it defends a perfect stranger you.

And when you see a flag covered casket, stand in memorium of all the soldier's faces you've examined. For when one of them falls, they all fall. And when one of them stands, they all stand.

Shouldn't we stand with them?
