## Pastor's View

You may get tired of hearing me say this, but I love Advent. It is my favorite season of the church year, and not just because blue, which is my favorite color, is the color of the season...although that does add to it being my favorite. As we heard on Christ the King Sunday, Advent is the beginning of the church year. We are starting over and going back to the beginning, and to begin to tell the Church's story yet again. You'll notice that our Gospel texts will transition from Luke to Matthew, inviting us to hear this story from another perspective. There are of course similarities, but we get to hear the same stories in different ways and encounter how the Bible, God's Word, continues to be living among us and is constantly speaking to us in new ways.

So back to Advent, it is my favorite season because only God would think to kick off a new year by having us enter into a time of waiting. This is so contrary to our ways of thinking and doing in this world. Whenever something new happens, whether it be at home, work, school, and so forth, "new" means busy! There are last minute details to finalize, perhaps a party to throw, working hard for there to be energy and excitement over this new thing, and a million contingency plans to think of, and a thousand scenarios to prepare for. Instead of all of that, however, God has us begin the new church year by waiting. Why?

I believe that God knows us humans far better than we know and understand ourselves, and I believe God knows all about how we humans often start 'new' things with all that doing. So instead, God has us begin this new thing by waiting, because we regularly need the reminder that God is the one in charge, and that this is ultimately not about us but about who God is and what God does. Who is God? God is the creator, who formed us and all of creation out of nothingness, gave us life, and called us 'good.' God is love, who loved the world so much that God sent Jesus Christ to live with us, die for us, and rise again for us. What does God do? God creates, God loves, and God is reconciling all things to God's self through the cross of Jesus Christ. Nothing about who God is or what God does requires us to do or to be anything other than God's good and beloved creation.

May this Advent time of waiting be a reminder to you that this is about God and Jesus, and not about what we do or don't do. May this Advent time of waiting remind you that God is the one in charge. And may this Advent time of waiting bring you peace, love, joy, and hope.
