Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th this year, and with it we find ourselves again in a season that asks us to slow down and ponder and reflect. While Lent can often be a more penitential season, one where we are invited to reflect on our own lives and shortcomings, I would invite us to reimagine Lent a bit this year. To my mind there are plenty of things in the world that remind us all how we are not enough. While inflated egos do exist in the world (sometimes it's even our own), for many of us, it is far easier to come up with a list of the ways we fall short than it is to come up with a list of our gifts. So as we reimagine Lent this year, I invite us to consider this season as one that reminds us of the world's deep need for what Christ has done for creation on the cross.

This season, I invite us to contemplate the evils that exist in this world that can be uncomfortable for us to think about. I invite us to contemplate the nuances of the events going on in the world that the media wants us to view in black and white, but the reality is much more gray. I invite us to consider these things because I find it's important to contemplate the magnitude of the life and death of Jesus Christ. Every once in a while, our minds should be in awe that the Creator became created in Jesus Christ and that in Jesus Christ, the Almighty and everliving God died. It's a lot to wrap one's mind around. Regardless of that though, the world needed and still needs Christ who was born and Christ who died on the cross. And because Jesus's pain and suffering erased our sin, we are freed and invited to, not shy away from, but to lean into the pain and suffering and sin of the world. We are freed to name reality for what it is, because we trust in the hope and promise of the cross, that through Jesus all things have been reconciled to God.

As we journey through the 40 days of Lent, let us ponder together what it means that Jesus died for the sake of the world, and how this world so desperately needs the love, reconciliation, and redemption Jesus freely gives from the cross. As we lean into the pain of the world, may the Holy Spirit give us the eyes to see how Jesus is already in those painful place, and that God is working through that pain and evil. May we come to know and trust more deeply our God who always shows up, particularly in those unlikely places, bringing new life.
