Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Last month, I asked us to contemplate together in this Lenten season the world's deep need for the cross of Christ. This month, I would like us to think about the 'so what' of that contemplation. It is one thing to know we need something or need to do something (I need to drink more water and less coffee) and another thing to actually do it (but, sometimes coffee just sounds better, and it's mostly water anyways, right?). It is very easy to look around the world and notice all the things that we and others need saving from through the power of the cross. However, it is another thing to look at those same situations and ask ourselves, "God, how are you already at work in that situation?"

We pray in the Lord's Prayer, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven, and Martin Luther reminds us in the Small Catechism that in praying this, we trust that God is already and always at work bringing about God's kingdom to all times and places without our help, but we pray this so that it may be true in us, so that we would participate in what God is already doing in the world. When we take the time to notice how God is already working against the evils of the world, we move from a place of despair to a place of hope. This is not meant to sugar coat awful things, rather our hope in Christ is a corrective lens that prevents despair and hopelessness. Awful things are awful, and we still have hope in Christ; both things are equally true. As Christians we are a hopeful people who name death and evil for what they are, but we do not stay there, we also notice the resurrection.

Noticing the resurrection is the 'so what' of having a greater awareness of the world's need for the cross of Christ. When we notice the resurrection alongside the deep need for the cross, we cannot help but want to participate with God in what God is already doing there. In this way we run counter-cultural to the ways of the world that pull us to two extremes: utter distraction from reality, or utter despair in reality. We live with a foot in both worlds. We know and see the death and evils around us, and we know what happens Sunday morning. The tomb is empty, and the world is forever changed. Thanks be to God.


