Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia! At the beginning of Lent I invited us to contemplate together ours and the world's deep need for the cross of Christ, and to lean into and notice the pain of the world around us in a more intentional way. As I contemplated and prayed on this, one of the things God reminded me of was how pain and death always seem to be looking to isolate us from one another, and how through the cross Jesus shows us that that isolation is a real feeling we are experiencing, but it is not the truth. Because the truth is that Christ is with us, and God has given us each other, so we are never alone in the midst of that pain and death, even though it can feel that way. God demonstrates and promises us that we are never alone by Jesus's death on the cross and Jesus's resurrection which destroyed the power of death forever. It can be so easy for me (and I think others as well) to fall into thinking that I am the only person experiencing the things I am going through and that no one else could understand me. However, when I am honest with others about how I am feeling, I find that I am not alone. I am reminded that God has given me, and all of us, wonderful relationships to help along the way. I think we live in a world that needs to hear this promise that through the cross, we are never ever alone.

This is the good news of this Easter season! We need to hear that we are not alone, that God is with us, that God goes with us in life and death, we do not have to believe the lies of the world that tell us we are alone, and death is not the final word! Alleluia! In this Easter season, I invite us to notice hope. As Christians we have a hope that at times can feel foolish and ridiculous. We claim and believe that God is with us always, especially in the suffering of the world. Logically, this doesn't make sense, but for a God who dies for God's people (for you) nothing could be more in line with who our God is. Our hope in Jesus is what gives us strength to live each day, no matter what comes. It is our hope in Jesus that frees us to name reality and to proclaim the promise that in Christ all will be well.

May the joy and promise of the resurrection fill you with hope this Easter season. May the Holy Spirit give us all eyes to see the hope of salvation in Jesus Christ all around us.
