Pastor Writes

How can it be that something so natural can be the cause of such controversy?

Hmmm.

I'm talking about snow.

Yesterday, while it was still October, we had our first snow, which I thought was absolutely beautiful. The flakes were so big that the mind half-expected to *hear* the sound of their impact as they landed on the ground, so big that I expected the tree branches to jar and jolt and jostle as they were bombarded by flakes the size of large moths. But no, it was silent and still, and beautiful.

Do you remember that day? I was walking past an upstairs east-facing window and paused for a minute or two to watch the snow fall on the boys' sandbox and treehouse. I almost couldn't tear myself away from that window. When is the last time you gazed upon something so utterly beautiful you had to force yourself to look away?

Iowa winters don't bother me, save for the fact that I never completely warm up until about mid-April. Ice, I hate, as we all do. Snow, I love, as we all *should*. But, as it turns out, not all do. We are a people divided when it comes to snow.

Throughout that snowy day, a surprising number of people grumbled and complained...time to dig out the snow shovels...time to get the car ready for the winter...I don't even have any salt yet...it's the ugliest time of year...I don't have any boots or coats for the kids yet...now I have to start thinking about the stupid holidays...

These are things I actually heard. Hmmm.

We all do realize we do not live in Hawaii or southern Italy or Florida, right? They have their own stunning landscapes and climates...we have corn fields and wooded river valleys that just happen to look stunning this time of year—this

fleeting autumn-into-fall transformation. I find this time of year altogether majestic. Breathtaking.

But it also stirs within me a deep panic. Because the changing of the seasons are a visual reminder of That Thing we all want to ignore—the passage of time. Birth. The infant growing into a child. The child growing into a man or a woman. The woman or man growing strong, maturing, growing feeble, growing old. Death. The changing of the seasons, the flipping of the calendar; the ones born this year will be the class of 2030. things march on, and there is nothing we can do about it. And sometimes that makes me panic, and you, too, I'm sure. Because it means I am getting older, and you are, too. And our kids are getting older, and soon, if they don't already, they will drive and vote and work and marry and discover their own lives...and it all begins with that first wobbly step we capture on video. The step because a jog, becomes a sprint, becomes a mile, becomes a state, a country, a continent.

These are the things I pondered in that minute (maybe two) as I looked out the east window and watched it snow, in that jungle that is my brain. Sometimes fleeting things are the most beautiful, because they have to be savored before they disappear forever. I know we will have more snow, but that was the *first* now, and a gorgeous one at that. And I remembered Jesus' parting words to his disciples, "I won't be with you much longer..." and they protested and panicked and cried and clung to him...He, too, was a natural thing of beauty that everyone should have savored, but some didn't, and so they killed him. But he'll be back. Because grace is all about repeat performances.

If we think of every moment—and every person—as a fleeting gift, then perhaps we might savor and appreciate them all the more, and cling while we can.

The boys tumbled through the door at the end of the day, shouting all at the same time, "Mom, did you *see* that snow? Wasn't that *AWESOME*?" I'm relieved that they have inherited the gene of appreciation. I smiled, "Of course I saw the snow. Of course it was awesome!" Then one said, "It's sad that it melted, but it was great while it lasted."

Which is exactly my point, just better put.
