Pastor Writes

Some of you will recognize this story from Facebook. If so, please bear with me. If this story is new to you, please bear with me. There is a point. Isn't there always? ©

The other day at breakfast, Jacob said, "Mom, I think instead of buying presents, we should take that money and give it to the guy ringing the bell outside of the store."

Philip said, "I think you should shut up, Jacob!"

Christian said, "Mom, how long do they have to be my brothers?"

This is a perfect three-fold example of how human beings receive the message of Christmas.

Some people get the point. Some people really, truly grasp that Christmas is about God giving us the gift of his own Son....that this Son Jesus will grow to be a man who will be sacrificed to take away the sins of the world. Some people marvel at the depth of love that God has for us, that he would offer his own son up to death in our place. This is a mysterious, gracious love that is less understood with the mind than it is grasped with the heart. These are heart people.

Other people like the stuff. They like the bells and presents and trees and treats and parties and mistletoe and all that. They love the festive side to the season of Christmas. They know they should somberly ponder the incarnational mysteries of God-made-man, but, truth be told, they are bursting with holiday cheer...they want halls to be decked, they wants bells a'jingling...they want Santa coming right down Santa Claus Lane...These are gut people.

And there are still others who wearily look heavenward and, like the psalmist, ask the timeless question, "How long, O Lord?" How long do I have to put up with my brothers who drive me crazy? How long do I have to put up with crazy holiday parking lots? How long do I have to put up with Christmas music that has been playing since mid-October? How long to I have to put up with hordes of wild-eyed people everywhere I turn? *How long, O Lord, how long?* These are mind people.

The first is a philanthropist.

The second is a narcissist.

The third is a pragmatist.

There is room for all around the manger.

I am sometimes a philanthropist, sometimes a narcissist, sometimes a pragmatist. So are you. Each one of us is a complex combination of benevolence and selfishness. Our hearts tell us to love our neighbor; our instincts tell us to fight for survival; our minds tell us to think it through logically. We are complicated creatures, to be sure.

I laugh thinking of the three Wise Men, traveling a vast distance from the east to find the newborn king. If these men were anything like I suspect my three (wise guys) will grow up to be, I am certain their conversation was not always royal and majestic.

Perhaps the first wise man said, "I think we should spend all our money and give this new king the most expensive gifts we can."

Perhaps the second wise man said, "I think you should just shut up!"

Perhaps the third wise man looked up at the stars and said, "How long do I have to travel with these guys? They're driving me crazy."

There was room for those three at Jesus' manger. There is certainly room for my three at Jesus' manger. And there is most certainly room for you.

At the November Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Worship Committee: Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services were finalized;
- Education Committee: the Christmas program will be held on December 15, 10:30 a.m. at Our Savior's; there will be no Sunday School classes on December 22 and 29 classes will resume on January 5, 2014; Luther League will meet in the kitchen on the first Sunday of each month during the Sunday School/Adult Bile Class hour; youth have completed Angel Tree shopping, are considering a name change for the group and will occasionally invite 5-6th graders to meetings;
- Faith Annual Meeting will be held on January 26, 2014 immediately following 8:00 a.m. worship; Our Savior's Annual Meeting will be held on January 26, 2014 immediately following 10:30 a.m. worship;
- Financial reports of organizations and committees, budgets and audit reports for the congregations are due in the church office by January 20, 2014;

The Epiphany of Our Lord



Epiphany is the festival on January 6 celebrating the manifestation of Christ to the world, recalling the visit of the magi.

The date of January 6 coincided with the winter solstice in the eastern part of the Mediterranean world, where this festival was first observed in the third century. This observance pre-dates the December 25 Christmas observance by a century.

The number of magi is not known; the fact of the three gifts may account for the idea of three magi. They may have been sages who specialized in astronomy, perhaps Zoroastrian priests from Persia (present-day Iran). That they were Gentiles, not Jews, is why the Epiphany festival celebrates the revelation of Jesus as the Christ to the whole world.

The gift of gold was valuable, a gift fit for a king. Frankincense was a type of incense used in worship, symbolizing prayers rising to God. Myrrh was a fragrant resin used in oil for anointing and to prepare a body for burial.


