

Pastor Writes



Jacob has played the violin for two years now.

When he first started as a kindergartener, his hands were so small he had a hard time with the fingering...he really had to reach and stretch. His first violin was a ¼ size. At the end of that first year he had grown into a ½ size violin. His growing hand wrapped around the neck with less stretching.

He then took a year off.

This past October, he picked up lessons again. When we got him fitted for his violin, we were surprised to see his arm and hand sizes required a ¾ violin. Just this past Monday, his teacher noticed his posture while playing and informed us that in these few months since getting his ¾ size, he had already outgrown it. She said at his growth rate, he would quickly outgrow a full size violin, and his arms and fingers would soon prevent him from playing the violin altogether. Jacob's face was crestfallen. He loves this instrument.

"However," she said, "I think you are perfect for the viola. You play it just like a violin, but you need to learn a new clef."

Jacob pondered this. They discussed it for an hour. They considered and discarded the bass (whew!) and the cello (rats!). They settled on the viola. I took a picture of the last lesson he would have on his beloved violin. He cried. His teacher cried. Musicians are gorgeously sensitive creatures. This made me cry, too, of course.

And so yesterday we dutifully went to Griggs to exchange the violin for the viola. The staff at Griggs applauded Jacob's graduation to his next instrument. He beamed with pride. When the time came to actually *hand over* the instrument, however, he was less composed.

"I don't want to let go of it," he whispered,

looking down at the floor, shy and sad.

"I know," I said, "but you'll learn to love this new instrument just as much."

The lovely employee who was helping us (a string player herself) whispered into his ear (rather loudly, in order to be heard over Philip on the steel drum and Christian on the acoustic drums), "If you don't let go of it, the next child won't get a chance to love it as much as you have."

He released his grip on his beloved violin case.

He then grasped the viola case.

He opened it. He took the viola out and placed it under his chin. It looked too big for him, like when a kid gets new shoes or a new bike. Too big. Awkward. But then he grasped the bow and played from memory Beethoven's "Ode to Joy," which he played on Christmas Eve at Our Savior's. A bit big, but graceful. It was new and familiar. It was the same melody, of course, just deeper, richer.

He beamed.

"We'll take it!" he said to the lovely lady helping us.

"I knew you would," she winked back.

How often does God call us to release something that we love so much and yet have outgrown? How often does God call us out of our comfort zone, into a brand new place, a new way of thinking, a new way of interpreting the world, ourselves and even God? It is a scary thing to let go of an ideology or a mindset or an opinion and consider—even for a moment—something new.

And yet we believe and confess that God provides for us from the future, as he has in the past. Can we be bold enough to reach for the unknown...to learn a new thing...to consider a new possibility...to ponder a new concept...to (Continued on next page)

contemplate a new perspective? It is a scary thing to let go of anything that we have grown to love...can we trust that God will supply us with something new to embrace? Perhaps we will be better for it, if we have outgrown the shoes we are in, the bike that we ride, the instrument that we play. Perhaps the next thing we pick up will surprise us—dare I suggest even delight us? Perhaps we will recognize the familiar shapes and melodies and structures, but they will be somehow deeper, richer, even more beautiful than we had dared hope.

Can we reach and stretch into God's future, trusting in his grace? Perhaps.

At the January Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Worship Committee did not meet and has rescheduled for January 23.
- > Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee did not meet but are looking in to scheduling a parish bowling event.
- Education Committee did not meet. Luther League has designed t-shirts available for purchase; bake sales will be held on the first and third Sundays of the month; officers were elected; fundraisers will be held to offset incurred costs; the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering will be in Detroit, Michigan.
- The PCC proposal for Pastoral Salary was accepted as printed: the benefits portion of the proposal reflects 100% coverage by the parish; total cost of health insurance may be reduced if the cost is shared between parents on a 50/50 basis; Christensen will seek clarification on the percentage for which the parish is responsible.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were accepted with a designated balance of \$5,419.45 and a working balance of \$16,275.00.
- > Christensen will seek clarification about the purpose of the Study Bible accounting item;
- ➤ Boiler repair required the installation of one, rather than two tanks.
- > Braet will remove snow from the parking lots.
- ➤ Correspondence was read from Jeannene Bousselot and the Southeastern Iowa Synod.
 - > Annual meeting preparations were finalized.
- ➤ Property and Management Committee is seeking volunteers for exterior church decoration. Interested person should contact a member of the committee.
- ➤ Brian Tulley, representing the Property and Management Committee, explained the 2014 Proposed Budget which was accepted as printed.
- Our Savior's Council:
- > Treasurer's report was passed around and discussed.
 - > There was no cemetery update.
- > Auditing and Nominating Committee members update: Shane Glover will be off council and will be on nominating committee. Dan Burke

requested a member of council stay after services and audit with him.

- > Budget was approved but still need to ask questions for Pastor Sarah's medical package.
- > Jason reported property insurance is \$3,659.00
- > Accepted Brandon Bousselot's request to transfer membership from Our Savior's to Immanuel Lutheran in Grand Mound.
