Pastor Writes

Last spring I took the boys to the Quad Cities Symphony to see Midori, a Japanese American violinist who was on tour from the New York Philharmonic. She was traveling the United States, going to schools and doing performances in order to encourage young people to play classical instruments. The Quad Cities Symphony hosted the free event called "Hot Dog, We're Going to the Symphony!" This is the event we attended, which included hot dogs and chips for the kids before watching Midori practice with the QC symphony. They were overwhelmed by the community's response, and ended up feeding and hosting over 400 young people.

I thought I saw fear in the symphony's eyes when they looked out and saw over 400 children attending their rehearsal.

I remember thinking, "Well, we'll be leaving this rehearsal in about five minutes." I tried to prepare myself for the embarrassment of actually getting kicked out of a classical event. The boys were so excited, they were squirming around in their seats. The parents of 400 children met each other in the eye, all wondering the same thing, "What in God's name were we *thinking*?"

They didn't calm down when the rehearsal began. In fact, they got more and more excited. They even pulled out little notebooks and pencils and started taking notes on what they observed and what they heard. One neighborhood boy who was with us actually sketched what he saw. The rehearsal didn't stop or even slow down, despite the barely-contained, pulsating enthusiasm of 400 kids plus adults.

The symphony was wearing jeans. They had bottles of water by their feet that they would swig from when they had a break between measures. A few even had ballcaps on. When a mistake was

made, you could even hear laughter...but the music never stopped. It kept going, despite giggles from the occasional blunder, despite crying babies in the audience, despite the excited shuffling of feet from observing children. The music went on, not stopping for any interruption. It was a carnival atmosphere.

Then came the most surprising moment, and for me, the most fun.

There was a man sitting in front of us, with his arm resting comfortably around his wife's shoulders. From time to time, he would nibble on her fingers. She tapped her feet in time to the music, his eyes were closed, listening, content. They were a sweet couple to watch. Their affection disgusted the boys. Whatever.

Suddenly, the man stood up and made his way slowly to the stage. "Great," I thought, "we have a wondering crazy person now." He climbed the steps to the stage, made his way to the very back of the symphony, waited, waited, waited, and suddenly beat on the big bass drum for about six measures. Then he returned his fuzzy felt drum sticks to their stand, and climbed down the stairs, resumed his place next to his wife, draped his arm around her shoulder and closed his eyes again.

What in the world? I thought.

What sort of crazy rehearsal was this, with ballcaps on cellists and Evian bottles on the conductor's stand and wandering percussionists who nibble their wives fingers, to the utter disgust of my sons? After the rehearsal, I chatted with this guy. Here's what he said:

This rehearsal was the best night of my life.

He described the random applause that would break out from the kids in the audience, the loud whispering that echoed throughout the hall, the (Continued on following page)

shadows of moms standing in the aisles, swaying their babies to sleep, the occasional shouts of, "I have to go potty!" He said it was the most genuine audience, the most real performance, played not to ignorant children, but to kids who hadn't yet learned to hide their joy and appreciation. What a fascinating insight.

It is highly likely that life is not the polished performance we expect it to be. The Bible reveals a pretty messy human performance, in fact. Can there be joy in the unrefined, unsophisticated times, when we play for God or when God plays for us, and it doesn't go as planned or as expected, but quite possibly, much better and much more genuine than we ever could have dreamt? Maybe life is not a performance for God, but a series of rehearsals which are in and of themselves, stunning and gorgeous.

2014 Noisy Offering Designated

Once a month, the youngsters who take part in the Sunday morning children's sermons pass little tin buckets amongst the congregation, hoping to make a lot of noise collecting coins. This money is then sent to a place or people that the church councils have selected for the year. Last year, in addition to several Busy Bags for little ones in church, \$1,389.29 was sent to Messiah Lutheran Church in Parlin, New Jersey. The Messiah Lutheran church building was severely damaged by Hurricane Sandy, as well as many of their member's homes.

This year the councils selected the Calamus/Wheatland School District as the recipient of the Noisy Offering and other special service donations with the request from the councils that the monies be earmarked for the Nutrition and Health of the students. It will be a fun challenge to see how much "noisy money" we can collect for the school. (We also accept soft, quiet currency, as well!)

At the February Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Worship Committee has finalized the Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship services no Seder Meal will be held this year.
- ➤ Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee has planned a parish bowling event at DeWitt Lanes from 1—3 p.m. on February 23; Barb Flynn is researching a special event for children.
- ➤ Education Committee has set goal to include providing intergenerational activities, increasing the incorporation of Lutheran publications into lessons and worship and selecting VBS dates when the final day of school is known.
- ➤ Dan Burke will contact Heather Grau regarding the progress of a parish Facebook page;
- ➤ In 2014 the Noisy Offering and special service donations will be given to the Calamus-Wheatland School District with the request monies be earmarked for the Nutrition and Health of the students. Pastor Sarah will inform the district.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were accepted with a designated balance of \$4,366.28 and a working balance of \$14,616.21.
- ➤ The \$206.25 balance accounting item for Study Bibles has been redirected to the Confirmation Camp Fund.
- ➤ The \$132 monthly ChemSearch bill for boiler repair was explained by Dirk Braet to include two service calls and related chemicals. The eight month contract expires July 2014. The boiler is functioning efficiently and all internal tanks, pipes and traps are clean, Braet will request the itemized invoice for the recent installation of one boiler tank, related parts and labor which cost \$5,100.
- ➤ Despite frequent reminders, Josh and Zach Poell have submitted no itemized bills for snow removal since January 16.
 - > The elevator has passed annual inspection.
 - > Committee duties for 2014 were confirmed.
- ➤ The EPIC account contains \$938.74 and may be directed to college students attending specific colleges Mark Witte may be contacted for more information.

Our Savior's Council:

> Financial reports were reviewed. \$8,000 will

be transferred from the Edward Jones Account to the General Account to cover cost of the parsonage roof.

- New funeral guidelines were adopted stating families may use the facilities but meal preparation and clean-up will be the responsibility of the families.
- > Parish Coordinating Committee guidelines were reviewed.
- A review of the membership list will be done at a future date.

Faith Congregation Annual Meeting Notes



- ▶ On January 26, 2014, President Colette Christensen called the Faith Annual Meeting to order with 37 members present.
- ▶ Pastor Sarah led devotions.
- ▶ 2013 Annual Meeting minutes were read.
- ▶ Pastor's report, congregation and committee reports were reviewed and approved.
- ▶ Financial Secretary's report, Treasurer's report and Audit Committee's reports were presented and approved. Doreen Henning explained the variance in total in-flows in the treasurer's report compared to the financial secretary's report. Doreen also mentioned the reason the budget was over-spent in 2013 was due to spending over \$15,000 on the building.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was presented by Brian Tulley.
- Mike Tendall presented, on behalf of Jason Bousselot, a request to renegotiate his wages. In December, Jason had asked to be paid \$115 per service in 2014, a 92% increase. Mike made a motion that Jason be paid \$100 per service for the 2014 calendar year, which would include two paid Sundays off. Annette Braet seconded the motion. Considerable discussion took place. Voting was by ballot and the motion failed.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was approved.
- ▶ Taxation on wages was discussed. A 1099 will be prepared for all paid positions.
- ▶ Mark Witte and Brian Tulley were placed in nomination for the two open council positions and were elected.
- ▶ Colette Christensen and Larry Schau were thanked for their years of service on the council.
- ▶ Larry Schau, Colette Christensen, Doreen Henning and Annette Braet will serve as the 2014 Nominating Committee.
- ▶ Mike and Tina Tendall will serve as delegates to the 2014 Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly held in Coralville on May 30—June 1.
- ▶ Meeting was concluded with Colette Christensen leading the group in the Lord's Prayer.

Our Savior's Congregation Annual Meeting Notes



- ▶ Due to blizzard conditions, the scheduled January 26, 2014 meeting was postponed until February 2, 2014. President Dan Burke called the meeting to order at 11:36 a.m..
- ▶ Devotions were from 2 Corinthians.
- ▶ Minutes of 2013 meeting were read and accepted.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was reviewed.
- ▶ Julie Steines asked when money was put in the Memorial Account. Jason stated if it was given in the name of a person it went in the Memorial Account and if it was undesignated, it went in the General Account.
- ▶ The 2013 committee reports were accepted.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget remains the same as the 2013 Budge except for Pastor's salary.
- ▶ Lots of people were eliminated from *The Lutheran* magazine due to being inactive members.
- ▶ Giving is not currently meeting monthly expenses. The budget may need to be discussed at council meetings to decide priority of bill payments in the future.
- ▶ Changing the sharing of bills between congregations will need to be voted on by congregations.
- ▶ The 2014 Proposed Budget was approved temporarily so bills can continue to be paid.
- ▶ Marcia Edens has served 6 years on council and is now off. We currently have no name for filling in the vacancy.
- ▶ Dan Burke has served three years on council and volunteered to serve another three.
- ▶ Deb Detlefs was nominated to serve on council and was elected.
- ▶ Mark Olson and Marcia Edens will serve as delegates to the 2014 Southeastern Iowa Synod Assembly in Coralville the weekend of May 30.
- ▶ There are basically four people most of the time to serve funeral meals and clean up afterwards. At the next council meeting, a discussion will be held and new funeral policies established.
- ▶ Meeting adjourned at 12:27 p.m.




