Cookies instead of coal

No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with accommodate

on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good (Romans 12:20-21).

I was young in ministry and stinging from criticism that seemed blatantly unfair. Fuming, I brought my hurt and righteous indignation to a colleague. He leaned back in his desk chair and listened to me vent. When I was finally done, he smiled mischievously and suggested, "Maybe what you need to do is heap some burning coals on their head." I was puzzled. What kind of advice was this? He sent me off to check the verse. I'm still checking it for loopholes.

When another party has injured me enough so that I think of them as my enemy, the last thing I want to do is offer punch and cookies. At the party that Jesus throws, the enemies are greeted at the door with a glass of wine and fresh bread. How offensive. Paul throws out the zinger. Do not be overcome by evil.

Funny. I thought I was avoiding evil by staying out of their company or putting them in their place. What did I accomplish? How am I supposed to know my enemies are hungry, thirsty? I sit down and listen to them, with my own hunger and thirst. Shockingly I discover they love their children as much as I love mine, feel hunger and thirst and exhaustion the same as I do.

I feel charitable. I share my bread. Then I am provoked. They didn't say thank you. They didn't turn around to my way of thinking. They don't merit my gift. I couldn't buy their esteem. Maybe I discover that they are very different indeed, that I was wrong to expect that underneath we are really all alike. A lowest common denominator isn't enough to change the equation.

Pass the bread anyway. Do good anyway. Do not let the evil of another call out evil in one's self.

What would happen if shipments of food for the hungry fell into enemy hands? What would happen if the person who reached out to ask for change used it for alcohol or cigarettes or something wasteful of which we do not approve? What would happen if, instead of building higher fences, we took some fresh bread and beverages over to our neighbor's porch? I wonder whose head would be heaped higher with burning coals of repentance?
