I thought that I should take this opportunity to introduce myself to you. I have been here about one month and this is my first chance to write something for the newsletter. I was born in northwest Iowa in the town of Estherville. My father was a dairy farmer, although he also owned a service station for part of that time, so I learned to pump gas, wash, and service cars. I graduated from Lincoln Central High School in 1964. From there I spent one year at Augsburg College in Minneapolis, then back to Estherville for one year at Estherville Junior College. I graduated from Dana College in Blair, Nebraska, with a B.A. degree in history in 1968. Shortly after graduation I entered the U.S. Air Force where I served four years as a radio intercept analyst in Texas, Italy, and Alaska. In 1969 I married Barb whom I met at Dana College. Barb was able to accompany me to Italy and Alaska. After I was discharged from the Air Force I entered Northwestern Lutheran Theological Seminary, St. Paul, MN. Part of my seminary education was serving as an intern at Central Lutheran Church, Regina, Saskatchewan. I graduated with a Master of Divinity degree in 1976 and was ordained at Christ Chapel, Gustavus Adolphus College, St. Peter, MN on June 6, 1976. Barb and I then moved to Chariton, Iowa, to serve First Lutheran Church. From there we went to Davenport where I started All Saints Lutheran Church, then to Stanton, Iowa, and Mamrelund Lutheran Church. After Stanton we moved on to Lawrence, Kansas and Trinity Lutheran Church. While there I earned a Master of Business Administration degree at the University of Kansas in 1992. Finally we moved to Iowa City where I served Christ the King Lutheran Church, retiring in 2011 after twenty years there. Along the way Barb and I had three children: Rachel, Erik, and Sarah.

We have now added six grandchildren to our family. Since retirement I have served as an interim pastor at First Lutheran Church and Holy Redeemer Lutheran Church, both in Cedar Rapids. I am now happy to serve Faith and Our Savior's Lutheran Churches.

While I am here serving you I do ask one favor from you. I ask that you remember me each day in prayer. Each day I pray for about six families from Faith and six families Our Savior's. I also remember about six families from the congregation to which Barb and I now belong, Gloria Dei in Iowa City. Please, as you pray, remember to pray for our common mission of serving our Lord Jesus Christ. Also remember the Call Committee in prayer which has such an important task concerning the future of your congregations.

At the October Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Pastor Aanonson's report: Visits were made to people in DeWitt Hospital and Westwing; the first Confirmation class was held with 8 students and their parents in attendance.
- > Worship Committee: Pastor will discuss Children's Sermons with Marsha Witte; Jason Bousselot will continue to select hymns; On Reformation Sunday, October 26, regular worship service and Sunday School times will be maintained - Seminarian Martha Harrison will preside; the 7:00 p.m. Thanksgiving Eve worship service on November 26 will be held at Faith; Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee will coordinate the 6:00 p.m. meal; the Hanging of the Greens service will be November 30; Mid-week Advent services will be at 7:00 p.m. using the Holden Evening Prayer service – December 3 and 10 services will be held at Our Savior's and December 17 will be held at Faith; Christmas Eve worship will be at 9:00 p.m. at Our Savior's and Christmas Day will be at Faith at 9:00 a.m.
- ➤ Education Committee: 20 Care Kits were mailed to Lutheran World Relief; \$500 was raised by CROP Walk; Children's Christmas Program will be held on Sunday, December 21 at Faith at 10:30 a.m.
- ➤ Pastor Aanonson accepted the half-time Interim Pastor position.
- ➤ Information on the \$4,205 purchase of a new copier was shared.
- ➤ "Treat the Pantries" will be held on November 16 and 23 – donations will be matched by Thrivent and then dispersed among local food banks.
- ➤ The 'Ministry Site Profile: Maximum Total Compensation Package" was approved as printed.
- ➤ Rationale regarding the two-year length of confirmation class was discussed with no action taken course content guides the length of the class.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were accepted with a designated balance of \$214.08 and a working balance of \$23,884.59.
- ➤ A new service panel, outside meter and conduit will be installed by Eric Hoffmann Alliant Energy and the state will inspect upon completion;

- the installation of the on-demand water heating system and the air conditioning unit will be coordinated with this project.
- ➤ The older boiler pump locked up a repair quote will be sought; the boiler service contract which expired in July will not be renewed.
- A key safe box has been installed by Brian Tulley near the front entrance of the church the key will no longer be stored in the parsonage garage.
- > Tulley will install a white board product on the face of the existing chalkboard.
- > Dirk Braet will seek a file cabinet to replace one in the secretary's office.

Our Savior's Council:

- > Approved financial reports with a balance of \$2,980.26.
 - > Fire extinguishers have been updated.
- > Evergreens have been planted on south side by Don Coobs memorial.
- A repair man has been contacted for low water pressure at parsonage and the church kitchen.
- There are extra cookbooks available for sale at church.

Much like the turkey, cornucopias are a staple at the Thanksgiving table. But, where did these horned vessels overflowing with goodies come from?

Cornucopias have a surprisingly rich history, going all the way back to 5th century BC. The mouthful of a name derives from two Latin words: "cornu," meaning horn and "copia," meaning plenty. That's why cornucopia and horn of plenty are often used interchangeably; we prefer cornucopia because it's just plain fun to say.

Originally, the cornucopia was made of a real goat's horn and filled with fruits and grains and placed in the center of the table. So, what's with the goat's horn? Well, the Greek legend states that Zeus, the Father of Gods and men, had to be banished to a cave so his cannibal father didn't eat him. While hiding out in the cave, a goat named Amalthea watched over Zeus and as she was nursing him, he accidentally pulled off her horn. Zeus promised that the horn would always bring her what she wanted and from then on, it represented endless bounty.

In the last several months, the Ebola outbreak has claimed thousands of lives. The virus has spread rapidly and the World Health Organization is now calling it "one of the world's most lethal diseases." Ebola has spread to multiple countries, the hardest hit being Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea.

In addition to health care, one of the most urgent needs is food. As people in affected areas are quarantined to their homes, towns are being shut down and people are not able to work, harvest crops or purchase food. Food shipments have stopped because people fear contracting the virus.

You can help. Your gifts to the Ebola Outbreak Response will be used – 100 percent – to assist those impacted by this crisis. Our partners and companion churches have requested our help in responding to the outbreak with food distributions, shipment of personal protective equipment, training health workers, outreach through education about prevention, and construction of an isolation unit at Phebe Hospital and School of Nursing in Liberia.

The ELCA and its predecessor church have walked with the people of Liberia for more than 150 years. Our long-standing relationship with our companions in Liberia and Sierra Leone provides a strong foundation to respond holistically to the needs of those who are suffering and living with the threat of Ebola.
