On Sunday, November 30, we began a new church year. We are now in the first season of that new year, the season of Advent. Advent is a different season. Advent is word that means "coming." During this season we celebrate the three-fold coming of our Lord. We begin Advent by celebrating the coming of our Lord at the end of all time. Now, that does seem peculiar. We just finished the old year by highlighting the coming of our Lord at the end of all time. We bring in the new year by continuing that theme. In other words we begin the story of our Lord by telling the end of the story. Even before we celebrate His birth, even before we celebrate His resurrection, even before we celebrate His presence among us through the Church we remember His promise to come again at the end of all time. So the first coming that we celebrate in Advent is His future coming. We begin the story by telling the end of the story. Just like many people who begin reading a mystery book by reading the end of the story first so that they know how the story ends, we do the same with the story of our Lord. Before we begin the story we know the end of the story. We know that the story ends in Christ. We know that our story ends in Christ. Thus, the future coming of our Lord is a story of comfort. Christ is coming again; that is the good news.

We then move on from the future coming of Christ to remembering and celebrating the coming Christ in the present. Christ comes to us every day through the Word, the water, the bread and the wine. In the reading and the proclamation of God's Word we meet our Lord. In the Word and water of Holy Baptism we meet our Lord. In the Word and the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper we meet our

Lord as we eat His body and drink His blood. Christ is continually coming to us. Christ is continually with us. As we go about our daily life we are reminded that Christ is not only coming again, but also that through His gifts of Word and Sacraments He is presently with us.

Finally, on the last Sunday of Advent we will be especially cognizant of the past coming of our Lord. which is also the first coming of our Lord, the coming of our Lord as a baby in a manger in Bethlehem. I know that we always want to celebrate Advent as preparing for Christmas. In doing so we impoverish ourselves by missing so much that Advent offers to us. We best celebrate the coming of Christmas by fully celebrating Advent and coming to an understanding of the three-fold coming of Christ. The time to celebrate Christmas is during the twelve days of Christmas (In other words, maybe the Christmas tree should not be tossed out on the curb by Christmas Day afternoon, as I have seen so often). The Christmas season ends on January 6, the Day of Epiphany, which in some ways is a continuation of the season of Christmas.

The theme of Advent is hope. And why do we have hope? Because Christ came to us, is coming to us, and will come to us. God in Jesus Christ is constantly coming to us. Thus, in all circumstances of life, we are people of hope. So, we begin the peculiar season of Advent. We celebrate the past, present, and future comings of our Lord, only in reverse order. We live in the comfort and hope of knowing that the story ends in Christ, that we are in Christ, and that God came to us to live among us in (continued on following page)



At the November Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Pastor Aanonson visited Lincolnway and Wheatland Manor residents; visitors have been stopping at the church during office hours on Wednesday afternoons.
- ➤ Worship Committee has finalized the services for Christ the King Sunday, Thanksgiving Eve, Hanging of the Greens Service, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day; input was sought from Joint Council regarding the time of the Christmas Eve service which resulted in a Joint Council decision to begin Christmas Eve worship at 8:00 p.m.
- ➤ Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee have ordered the food for the Thanksgiving Eve meal – confirmation students will assist with serving and clean-up duties.
- ➤ Education Committee reported children will practice for the Christmas Program during the Sunday School hour with an additional practice scheduled for Saturday, December 20 at Faith.
- ➤ The Call Committee reported the parish profile was submitted and the reference has arrived as of November 11, the parish is now posted on the synod web-site for review by prospective candidates.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$191.13 and a working balance of \$24,721.88.
- > The air conditioning, water heater and electrical service work will be completed as volunteers' time permits.
- Ryan and Associates have been paid for the boiler repair services council will research the cost and feasibility of installing a poly tank and motor for the heating system.
- ➤ Braet will deliver a 4-drawer file cabinet to Jeannene's office.
- ➤ Council designated \$500 to pay for a new stove. Naomi Circle has donated \$500 toward the purchase of a new stove the combined funds allow two stoves to be purchased as replacement for the one aged appliance in the kitchen.
- > The request by Rebecca Hurt and her son, Ryan Dick to transfer her membership to Faith Church from Our Savior's was approved.
 - > Snow removal will be sought with the

following stipulations: bills for monthly snow removal must be submitted for payment by the 5th of the following month, bulls must include the specific date for each snow removal, specific number of hours for each date – failure to provide accurate bill records may result in non-payment.

Our Savior's Council:

- ➤ A new pressure tank has been installed Culligan has been contacted to clean the iron filter.
- > Megan Will will replace Tom Olson on the Parish Coordinating Committee.
- ➤ Sign-up sheets for pies for the Thanksgiving meal and for the Advent meals on December 3 and 10.
