For the next few weeks at worship I will be greeting you with the words, "The Lord is risen." And you will respond, "He is risen indeed." This is an ancient greeting of the Church. It is also an ancient confession of faith of the Church. This is the Church's Easter greeting.

I could also just as well say to you at worship or any other time, "You are risen." And you could just as well respond with the words, "I am risen indeed." It is true. This is an Easter greeting to you 365 days of the year. This is true for you every day. I know that we often say that we celebrate every Sunday as an Easter. When we count the forty days of Lent we omit the Sundays because a Sunday is never a "fasting" day; it is always a feast day because it is always a celebration of Easter, the day that God our Father through the power of the Holy Spirit raised His Son Jesus Christ to life. The movement is from death to life. This is a moment that happened once, never to be repeated? Well, no! It is repeated and repeated many times every day in your life.

On the day that you were baptized God through the Holy Spirit drowned the old person, the old sinful person (even if you were an infant). And God through the Holy Spirit raised you up to be a new person. In that Holy Baptism God sees you dressed in the righteousness of Christ and He gives you the gifts of forgiveness of sins, delivers you from death, and gives to you eternal life. Baptism does that.

Now, we may think that we were baptized (past tense) and let it go at that. That is not the way Martin Luther thought about Baptism (thank God). Baptism is once and every day for Luther. Luther would not say, "I was baptized," but "I am baptized." Baptism is once and every day. It is

called "daily baptism." For Luther the benefits of baptism are not just a past event or a future event, but happen each and every day of your life. In other words you live each day with your sins forgiven, with death no long the orientation of your life, and with eternal life as a gift whereby you believe that you pass through the gate of death to life with Christ forever.

Each day is now a day that the Holy Spirit drowns the old sinful person and each day the Holy Spirit raises you to new life. Each day you experience a Good Friday and an Easter. Each day is your Good Friday when you die to sin by the power of the Holy Spirit. Each day is your Easter when you are raised to new life by the power of the Holy Spirit. So, you see, I could say to you, "You are risen." And you could answer, "I am risen indeed." You are indeed risen because the Holy Spirit on this day has raised you to new life once again, and will do so again tomorrow, and the day after and the day after and the day after that. Easter is every day because of God's work through the cross and resurrection and God's work through your Holy Baptism.

Luther continually reminded us that the life of one who has been baptized is a life of daily returning to one's baptism. We do that through repentance, contrition and repentance. Contrition is to know the pain of our sin, the pain it causes us, causes our neighbor, and causes our God. Repentance is to turn, again by the work of the Holy Spirit, back toward God away from sin. When we do that we once again rely on God's promise in Holy Baptism. The sinful person is drowned dead and God raises up a new person, the new person who is oriented toward new life in Christ. There we find God (Continued on following page)

once again who receives us in His all embracing love. Thus we live each day of our life raised to new life, a life of thanksgiving to God who daily raises us from death to life. To God who gives us the promise of an Easter each day of our life until we join our Lord in one great Easter celebration. "You are risen."

Joint Council:

> Pastor Aanonson has been visiting members in the hospital and nursing homes.

➤ Worship Committee has discussed upcoming services through Easter; proposed the early Easter service be changed from 6:30 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. because of the traveling distance for Pastor — later service would remain at 9:30 a.m.

> Council approved earlier starting time of 7:00 a.m. for the early Easter service.

> Stewardship Committee is sponsoring a Cosmic Bowling outing.

The Education Committee reviewed the successful past year of Vacation Bible School and plan to again hold VBS after school the first 3 Wednesdays of May.

Call Committee had an interview with a second candidate on February 28 and has decided not to proceed with that candidate. There is the possibility of another candidate to interview.

Faith Council:

Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$486.01 and a checkbook balance of \$30,858.46.

➤ Because the Sunday School offerings are much less than the amount committed to Compassion International, the item will be changed from a designated category to a budgeted category so it will not always show a deficit.

> Lenten Service offerings were approved to be designated to Compassion International.

> Diane Wilhelm and Mike Tendall have been added to the nominating committee.

> The plaster repair in the church has been completed and paid for.

Bats have been found in the church and a solution will be looked into.

> There is a leak on the return line of the boiler that appears to have gotten worse. The floor/cement will have to be removed over the area, the leak repaired and then recovered and retiled.

Cleaning day will be March 28 at 8:00 a.m. with April 4 as the rain date.




