Pastor's View

Thank You – Jane and I would like to thank everyone who has made the last few weeks bearable. There have been so many boxes, furniture, painting and fixing going on it is overwhelming at times. But then there was the response of the Installation and potluck meal which were fantastic. There are so many people we would like to thank but I am afraid I might miss someone. So THANK YOU to all who helped and continue to help. After the house is in order, stop in and see the changes to your house, our home.

Honeymoon Time – When a pastor and congregation are finally together, after the interviews, after the show and tell visits, and after the paperwork is signed, then we start the time called the honeymoon time. This is when we both place "all the hopes and dreams of all the years" in each other. This is a fun time. We are like a couple who are dating. We see only what we like and want to see. Let's enjoy this time together.

First Communion – I would like to thank the council and the congregations for looking at our first communion practices. The council asked that we talk to the congregations about what all the thoughts might be. That was a very good suggestion. It has given time to give some children's sermons, find some info for the congregations and write some thoughts about communion.

Communion is one of two means of Grace. Grace is a gift from God that makes faith happen in our lives. Baptism is the gift that brings us into God's love in a special way. (God's love is for all people, creation and the world.) We do nothing to receive what God has started. Luther tells us; "It means that

our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever." (Sm. Cat. Pg 25) Baptism is a daily event in our lives. The other event in our lives is a community faith action; communion. Holy Communion happens every Sunday at worship in the Calamus worship community. Like Baptism it is not something that we do. It is a gift from God that builds faith in our lives. In Luther's Sm. Cat. In the third Art. of the Creed He says, "I believe that I cannot by my own understanding or effort believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him." That reinforces the idea of grace. It is the work of the Holy Spirit to bring us to faith. Baptism, communion are both God's action. It is not the work of the people. The work of the people is often worship (Liturgy), service to others and personal devotions for growth in faith. The ELCA states that communion is between the person and the Pastor and age is not a factor. I would add that the local congregation has an input as to what they would like to see happen in their worship history. I would be in favor of any age as long as the family was teaching the importance of what is happening. Baptism and communion help keep our eyes on Jesus. We eat the bread of life and drink the life giving blood. This is a Spiritual mystery for us. I love the little ones who can say, "I want Jesus too!" This is a faith that says, I love Jesus!

Thank You for the talk time about communion.

Church Growth Ideas – While I was interviewing at different congregations I picked up two ideas that will strengthen the growth of any church. The first idea was a simple statement that carries a lot of (Continued on following page)

power in it. The summary statement said, "Keep your eyes on Jesus. All other problems fall away." It makes a lot of sense. If we are focused on Jesus, then we know what our priority is at all times. I know that we cannot fight about anything if we are focused on Jesus. It has the effect of removing our sinful self so the work of Jesus can get done. The second growth idea is small group bible study. In the one church I interviewed at there were seven small group bible studies going at one time. That means there were about 70 people in study at one time. That means there were 70 people who were in prayer at one time. The core faith group could get lots of power focused on Jesus and the problem they were working on.

These two ideas turned this so-so congregation into one of the nice powerhouses in the area. Its size was not the goal. Its mission to people was the goal for the congregation. This could be our goal too.

This year's Noisy Offering has been designated for ELCA World Hunger's Walk for Water. The goal of this project is to raise \$500,000 for ELCA World Hunger supported water projects around the world in 2015.

At the July & August Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ The Christian Outreach Committee is working on a float for the Calamus Fun Days
- ➤ Pastor Bill Runaas' ministry with the Calamus Lutheran Parish begins August 1, 2015. He will preach on August 2. His accepted and signed Letter of Call has been received.
- ➤ Pastor Aanonsen's last Sunday will be July 26. A potluck is planned at 11:00 a.m. at Faith Church.
- ➤ Pastor Runaas' installation will be August 16. A barbecue is planned at noon at Our Savior's with members of the congregations asked to bring side dishes.
- ➤ The parsonage is almost ready for Pastor Bill and Jane.
- > Outreach Committee is planning an outing at Doug Bousselot's pond.
- ➤ The first day of Sunday School will be September 13 at Our Savior's.
- A consensus was reached that kids communion will stop until a decision is voted on at the next council meeting. Pastor will do teaching of communion and its meaning during the children's sermons for the next five Sundays.
- Approval was given for the renewal of the copier contract at an increase of 2%.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$262.76 and a working balance of \$44,726.64.
 - > Ceiling fan has been installed.
- > Painting and carpet cleaning of the parsonage will be contracted.
- ➤ Property and Management will try to determine the source of condensation/water marks on the cement/wall/window sills in the sanctuary.
- > To determine where the church furnace boiler is leaking, the floor will need to be opened up more and a scope sent down.
- ➤ Painting is almost completed in the parsonage and new carpeting will be installed August 25.
- > Replacing the desk and chair in the pastor's office and additional parsonage improvements are being reviewed.
 - > Church Mutual determined damage from

recent hail storm: roofs are okay; north and west sides of garage and parsonage have siding damage; adjuster took pictures and claim will be left open to make sure no other problems are noted through the winter; adjuster also noted bats are most likely coming in the bell tower.

Our Savior's Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a balance of \$2,261.38.
- ➤ A thank-you card to Nila Mason was distributed and signed.
- ➤ The parsonage siding was damaged by hail Brian will get bids for new siding.


