

Pastor's View

Lent-Easter - We start the month of March with our walk of faith towards Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and then Easter Celebration. Our Wednesdays in Lent are a learning lesson in faith through the understanding of parables that Jesus taught. We end this journey faith with a Maundy Thursday service of scripture, washing of hands (new this year), Communion and then leaving in silence. This silence is a way to prepare for the worship of Good Friday. On Friday we will hear the message that it is our sinfulness that has put Christ on the Cross. It also shows us God's grace so we have the gift of relationship with God. We then march on to Easter Celebration. We start Easter where Good Friday left us; at a tomb with no hope. But we soon worship with "He is Risen!" "He is Risen Indeed!" I hope to see you at most of the Lenten/Easter journey.

Adult Class - Adult class has been fantastic. If you have been there you know that along with the study of the Gospel there has been a building of trust between pastor and all of us together. Once or twice we have finished a lesson, most of the time we have only had really good talks. It is hard to start something new; like coming to something you have never done before. We invite you come and be part of the fun.

Lent and Sin - In looking and writing about sermon materials for Lent, a surprising theme has

come forth. Sin is really powerful and devious is that theme. There are the big sins that are listed in the Ten Commandments and in Paul's lists of wrongs. Yet we seem to think that we are not sinners, or at least not as bad as our neighbor. As we look towards Good Friday the words "Jesus died for me." become very important. When we hear these words they bring a message of hope and love. The power of sin is defeated. Yet there is another way that phrase can be named. "Jesus died on the cross because of me." Do you hear the difference? "Because" carries the power of sin in our lives to the cross. Sin is devious. How devious? What is at the center of "sin?" It is that "I" that gets us in trouble. It is our nature to put self at the center of everything. That type of sin is what destroys the relationship between God and self and community. We can fool our view of sin by ourselves, but in community the power of sin is named and seen. There are some worship services that will help us prepare for the celebration of Easter. Don't let sin take away the power of Easter morning.

➤ There is a sufficient number of Study Bibles which allows the amount designated to purchase more bibles to be moved to the Undesignated Offerings.



Award \$47,583.81 in Grants

Women of the ELCA awarded \$47,583.81 in grants in 2015 to 18 domestic and nine international programs in 2015 to promote women's complete and total health: physical, emotional and spiritual.

Our grants program funds projects and agencies dedicated to education and advocacy, empowering women and girls to lead healthier lives.

The 18 domestic grants totaled \$34,900 and ranged in size from \$1,000 to \$3,000. They were awarded to programs in Washington, Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nebraska, Missouri, Texas, Iowa, Wisconsin, Ohio, Maine, North Carolina, Georgia and Washington D.C.

The nine international grants totaled \$12,600 and benefited programs in Cameroon, Ghana, India, Kenya and Uganda.



Living Lutheran in an election year

Alice Walker's poem "Democratic Womanism" begins with these wonderful lines:

*You ask me why I smile
when you tell me you intend
in the coming national elections
to hold your nose
and vote for the lesser of two evils.
There are more than two evils out there,
is one reason I smile.*

On this long, and increasingly strange, road toward Nov. 8 (election day), our Lutheran tradition has some sound words to offer amid all the white noise, all the chatter.

In a time when many question the role of government in our lives, Martin Luther's writings offer a vision for the power of government. In 1523, drawing on a sermon the Duke of Saxony had heard and enjoyed the year before, Luther set out to write "Temporal Authority: To What Extent It Should be Obeyed." In this writing he places governing among the other vocations Christians are called to, similar to marriage or to one's particular trade. He wrote:

There must be those who arrest, prosecute, execute, and destroy the wicked, and who protect, acquit, defend and save the good. Therefore, when they perform their duties, not with the intention of seeking their own ends but only of helping the law and the governing authority function to coerce the wicked, there is no peril in that; they may use their office like anybody else would use his trade, as a means of livelihood. For, as has been said, love of neighbor is not concerned about its own; it considers not how great or humble, but how profitable and needed the works are for neighbor or community.

I have to admit, it's difficult to see that sense of selflessness in American political life today. It's difficult to see the goodness of an office when the goodness of those who occupy them is ambiguous at best. Luther would have heard such a lament with sympathy. He later wrote:

You must know that since the beginning of the world a wise prince is a mighty rare bird, and an upright prince even rarer. They are generally the biggest fools or the worst scoundrels on earth; therefore one must constantly expect the worst from them and look for little good"

I'm with you, Brother Martin.

But with Luther's insistence on the legitimate role of government and yet his blunt realism concerning those who govern, what are we left to do, especially those of us who are called to the vocation of citizen—a calling that demands we participate?

Perhaps this election year we might turn to another Lutheran: Dietrich Bonhoeffer. In 1932 at a women's retreat, Bonhoeffer offered an extended reflection on prayer amid difficult political times. We must learn anew to pray "thy kingdom come," Bonhoeffer said.

Tucked there in the middle of the Lord's Prayer, it's easy to miss the radical invitation of that prayer, "thy kingdom come." For Bonhoeffer this little line holds the key to a middle way forward between private spirituality and idealistic misgivings. He wrote:

"Thy kingdom come"—this is not the prayer of the pious soul of the individual who wants to flee the world, nor is it the prayer of the utopian and the fanatic, the stubborn world reformer. Rather, this is the prayer only of the church-community of children of the Earth, who do not set themselves apart, who have no special proposals for reforming the world to offer, who are no better than the world, but who persevere together in the midst of the world, in its depths, in the daily life and subjugation of the world. They persevere because they are in their own curious way, true to this existence, and they steadfastly fix their gaze on that most unique place in the world where they witness, in amazement, the overcoming of the curse, the most profound yes of God to the world. Here, in the midst of the dying, torn, and thirsty world, something becomes evident to those who can believe, believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

And I'm with you too Brother Dietrich.

In the coming weeks as the news cycle spins even more quickly, as the rhetoric gets louder (and likely more selfish), may we remember the wisdom of our Lutheran inheritance: government is a vocation—a "place of responsibility" as Bonhoeffer would say, and a chance to love and serve our neighbors. And may we also embrace our own vocations as citizens, faithfully praying "thy kingdom."


