Pastor's View

<u>Easter</u> - We worship with "He is Risen!" "He is Risen Indeed!" I hope that you have been spiritually filled during this Easter journey. We journey through Easter towards Ascension and into Pentecost. Spiritually during Easter we can focus on our Baptism and Communion as it relates to the risen Lord and Savior.

Adult Class – We invite you come and be part of the fun. There has been a building of trust between pastor and all of us gathered together on Sunday Morning. It is hard to start something new; like coming to something you have never done before. Come and grow in faith and fellowship.

Mom's Bible Study — "Coffee and a Little Jesus" - Heather Grau is hosting a bible study and talk time about our faith. Moms and children are welcome. They will meet the first Tuesday of the month at 9 am. Call Heather at 563-424-0507 or email grau.heather@gmail.com.

1st Communion Class - We will be offering 1st communion classes for all ages of persons. If your child has questions about communion I would encourage them to attend the classes. If they have already had one class it might be helpful if they would take a refresher class. This is a two lesson class. We will use a DVD called Sacraments in Action and the book "A Place for You." Please call the office if you are going to attend. The dates are May 11(F.) & 18(O.S.) at 6:30. I am looking forward to the class time with you and your student.

Noisy Offering – In April our Noisy offering will go to the Syrian Refuges. Lutheran Disaster Relief is the contact agency for us. The offerings will be sent to the synod office and they will send the

offering on to LDR in our name. A designated offering is 100% to the people in need.

Middle East and Europe Refugee Crisis

The Situation: A record number of people are fleeing war and poverty in the Middle East in search of a better way of life – especially Syrians. Although they come from different countries, for various reasons, they share a common goal: hope for a brighter future. Many have fled with only the clothes on their backs. The situation is life-threatening.

Our Response: As a church, we are called to respond. Over the last four years, since conflict in Syria began, Lutheran Disaster Response has committed over \$1 million to help Syrian refugees who have been displaced because of bombardment, civil war and the growing threat of ISIS. Working with our companion churches and partners, Lutheran Disaster Response is providing food, diapers, blankets, water, health kits, hygiene kits and psychosocial services, in addition to continuing support of refugee camps. "In the face of evil, we remain confident that the good news of Jesus Christ liberates us and gives us the freedom and courage to discover and boldly participate in what God is up to in this world. 'The Gospel also frees us from fear to see others as brothers and sisters for whom Christ died and lives'" (ELCA Social Message on Terrorism, 2004).

<u>Confirmation</u> – Confirmation will be here before you know it. What can you do? Please pray for these young people as they move into a more adult life in faith. This is a hard transition to make. The transition involves moving from your parents (Continued on following page)

Of course the easiest is a card and money. But if you want to go a little farther; a book of faith would be wonderful. 
