### Pastor's View

Why Church? In step seven of AA, this step involves actions that we ask God to remove our short comings. We are asking God to change us. How is God going to remove these defects? God chooses to use very special tools. They don't look like much. Some water, some words, some bread and some wine. Touched by God's special grace these common and mundane elements become instruments of mercy. They are the channels through which the Holy Spirit leads us to the cross of Christ and works in us the forgiveness of sins, faith, and new life. Why church? Because Church is where we find Christ clearly and His gifts.

1st Communion Class - We will be offering 1st communion classes for all ages of persons. If your child has questions about communion I would encourage them to attend the classes. If they have already had one class it might be helpful if they would take a refresher class. This is a two lesson class. We will use a DVD called Sacraments in Action and the book "A Place for You." Please call the office if you are going to attend. The dates are May 11(F.) & 18(O.S.) at 6:30. I am looking forward to the class time with you and your student. May 22 is Celebration of First Communion.

Noisy Offering – May is our Noisy offering for the Syrian Refuges. Lutheran Disaster Relief is the contact agency for us. The offerings will be sent to the synod office and they will send the offering on

to LDR in our name. A designated offering is 100% to the people in need.

Ongoing conflict in Syria has displaced millions of people. Many have left their homes for more secure places within Syria while others are crossing the borders into the neighboring countries of Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq in search of safety and shelter. Stretched resources and political dynamics are increasing tension for those who are most vulnerable in the area. We are currently at work through our partners in Syria and the surrounding area. Our work with The Lutheran World Federation and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land includes meeting the needs of Syrian refugees who have traveled to Jordan. Camp management and the provision of access to proper shelter have been the primary focus of our work. We have committed over \$1 million to help support people who have been displaced within Syria. We are also providing camp management and housing for refugees in Jordan. But we need you. It is because of generous gifts from people like you that we are able to respond to people in need. Our unique relationships with Lutheran churches around the world enable us to be on the ground - making a difference. Your gift designated for "Syrian conflict" will be used in full — 100 percent — to respond to this conflict.

<u>Confirmation</u> – Confirmation is here. Please pray for these young people as they move into a more adult life in faith. This is a hard transition to make. The transition involves moving from your parents telling you have to go to church to attending church on your own. Pray for our youth. Pray for the parents. Pray for our youth because we love them. Invite our youth to worship with us.


