Pastor's View

Seeking God – I was reading a book that asked the question: are we seeking God in an active way in our lives? Are we looking for God as much as God is looking for us? His answer was that as a Christian we must be in a state of renewed interest in God's Word and Sacraments. Contact with God is made first through God's self-revelation. The hidden God makes himself known through his Word. For our time this is the Bible. It is a sad fact of the modern church that so few members are immersed in the Holy Scriptures. The Ancient Word that we read, mark, and learn evokes little response among the majority of church members. This leads to some distorted views of God and God's teachings. To know and understand what God is calling us to do can be only be understood in the background of the Word. This is where we learn the heart and center of our faith: the forgiveness of sins through faith in Jesus Christ. Here we build on the foundation of salvation by grace, through faith in Christ, apart for works of the Law. The spiritual strength of the sacraments are given to us to use. Baptism and Holy Communion are the

nourishment for the soul, and are needed to sustain a spiritual life. This is the power of community supporting one another in each other's faith.

Synod Assembly Thoughts - The church of the future is in good hands of the young leaders that are moving into positions of power within the Church. We who were at the Assembly saw the energy, new ideas, and the use of new technology to reach more people then were possible in our generation. Please pray for new leaders and pastors for the church. By 2018 or so there will be a need for 1,000 pastors in the ELCA. Talk to your sons and daughters about being ministers. Support young leaders in reducing their college and seminary debt load.

VBS Thoughts – What a great three meetings we had with the kids. Each week was better than the week before. The children became more involved each time they met. Thank you for all who helped, donated and supported this program.

2016 Synod Assembly

May 10, 2016

The 29th Assembly of the Southeastern Iowa Synod was held May 6 – May 7, 2016, at the Marriott Hotel and Conference Center Coralville, Iowa. Over 400 voting members and visitors gathered around the theme "Drawn to the Light of God."

Pastor Ruben Duran served as the churchwide representative providing updates and stories of the work we do together as the ELCA. The primary business of this year's assembly was election of synod council members, the synod consultation committee, and synod discipline committee, as well as several resolutions.

Bishop Michael Burk presided over the assembly, including the Friday evening service of Holy Communion. In his report, Bishop Burk provided highlights of our shared ministry since we last gathered in assembly, providing his assessment of the ways we are being "Drawn to the Light of God."

Special guest, Pastor Jason Chesnut engaged the Assembly with biblical storytelling from the the gospel of John. Pr. Joel Nau gave a presentation about hunger, Pr. Lee Schott presented about prison ministry and A.J. Houseman gave a talk centered on leadership. Additionally, there were interest groups and forums on various informational topics.

365 voting members and 66 visitors were attendance for elections, business matters and resolutions. 58% of voting members were lay voting members, 58% of those were female and 42% male.

Heather Miller was elected Synod Vice President. Dirk Amundsen, Pr. Ryan Cosgrove, Erik Ullestad, Pr. Gemechisa Mosa, Suah Borsay, Karen Goedekin, and Katie Harris were elected to positions on the synod council. Pr. Mike Schmidt, Pr. Karen Ullestad, Charlie Rod, and John Wright were elected to the Synod Discipline Committee. Pr. Jennifer Lutz, Carol Fredrich, and Heidi Larson, were elected to the Synod Consultation Committee.

Resolutions adopted included: 1) Ministry around the Military: a resolution encouraging those in the Southeastern Iowa Synod to offer gratitude and support for military personnel, veterans and their families. 2) Life of Faith initiative; encouraging the synod to create learning opportunities and communities to equip and support all its members for ministries in the world. 3) Southeastern Iowa Synodical Women's Organization encouraging congregations and groups to discuss and act on the role media plays in the objectification of women. 4) A resolution encouraging congregations in the Southeastern Iowa Synod to pray for, engage, and support Lutheran Campus Ministries at Iowa's public universities. 5) Peace Not Walls: a resolution encouraging the Southeastern Iowa Synod to advocate for a peaceful resolution to conflict, the end of human rights abuses, and the end of occupation of Palestinian territory through Israeli settlements in East Jerusalem and the West Bank. 6) A resolution of thanksgiving for the assembly and various ministries of the Southeastern Iowa Synod. Other business included the approval of the 2017 synod budget and minimum compensation guidelines. Congregations and rostered leaders celebrating anniversaries were acknowledged and voting members took advantage of the many forums and organizational displays that were offered during assembly. The synod assembly offering was designated to the ministries of the Southeastern Iowa Synod, \$35,987.78 was given by congregations and individuals.

- ➤ Pastor will be on vacation from May 26—June 11.
- ➤ Worship Committee reviewed Holy Week services; *With One Voice*, Setting V, will be used for worship on June 19—September 4. The committee will not meet in June or July.
- ➤ Stewardship and Christian Outreach Committee planned a parish breakfast at Bousselot Pond on June 12 following the worship service at Our Savior's; Movie night will be August 7 at Our Savior's.
 - > Photos of council members were taken.
- ➤ Joint Council gave their support to Heather Grau's request to organize "Meals of Love." She will compile and manage a list of people who will provide meals to members whose life circumstances are challenging birth of a baby, serious illness, surgery, or death in the family.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$799.74 and a working balance of \$33,908.34.
- > Two stairway railings have been installed by Keith Gasper and will be stained.
- ➤ Heritage Glass will check the windows over the altar cross and the main entry which have allowed water to leak inside the church.
- ➤ Paint for the walk-in entry doors has been purchased.
- A new microwave will be purchased for the parsonage.
- ➤ Insurance funds for hail damage will be made available when the contractor is ready to install new siding on the parsonage and garage.

- Approval was given to look for bids on siding and aluminum framing for windows.





"Acts of Kindness and Love" Monday Bible School



Forty-three children in kindergarten through fifth grade attended Bible School on three Mondays in May. They studied "Acts of Kindness and Love" in three Bible stories: four friends going to great lengths to help a paralyzed man meet Jesus (Mark 2:3-12), a boy sharing his lunch to feed 5000 people gathered to listen to Jesus (John 6:1-15), and Jesus' parable of a good Samaritan caring for a man beaten by robbers (Luke 10:25-37). The children considered: "What does Jesus teach us about loving our neighbor?" and "Who is our neighbor?" The sessions went smoothly thanks to 14 adults who organized or lead the stations and 4 youth helpers.
