Pastor's View

Advent – Thanksgiving is over and Advent is started. They seem to be the forgotten celebrations. The "X"-mas holiday music has started. This is silly music that is supposed to put us in the "x"-mas buying spirit. I am a hold out for real Christmas music and that funny season called Advent. Advent is the story about the coming of Christ Jesus. One little part sets us up for the birth of Christ. The rest of Advent tells the story of the coming of an adult Jesus who is King and will redeem the creation and the world.

Our worship theme this Advent is based on the following:

1) Spiritual worship, 2) Prayer, 3) Meditation and 4) Coming (birth). Worship is family friendly; supper at 6 p.m., worship at 7 and ready to go home by 7:35 (give or take a little). Make plans to attend. (Confirmands are required to attend.)

<u>Christmas</u> – Advent demands that we wait for Christmas to come. It is that waiting that drives many people to push the end of Christmas; to even Christmas afternoon. Our "X"-mas music and shopping days left adds to the end of Christmas. I like the wait. I like to celebrate Christmas starting Christmas afternoon. I like the power of Christmas music that tells the story of Christ starting

when Christmas starts. It may look like I believe in "Bah Humbug." But really I like the focus to be on God and God's gift to us. Not our gifts to ourselves. So when you see me in a happy mood after Christmas day you now understand my point of view.

As you give Christmas gifts this year please remember that the ELCA has some wonderful programs to support; hunger, refugees, and animals to start a new life. Good stuff to support.


Check the calendar or bulletin for worship times on Sunday School Christmas program, Christmas Eve and one service only on Christmas Day.

Children's Program "Gift of Love"



The children's program titled "Gift of Love" will be presented during the 10:30 worship at Faith on Sunday, December 18.

The first two rehearsals for the program will be at 5:45 pm on Wednesday, November 30, and 5:45 pm on Wednesday, December 7, at Our Savior's. The final two rehearsals will be at Faith on Wednesday, December 14, at 5:45 pm and Saturday, December 17, at 9:00 am. Children are invited to share their musical talents during the program's prelude by preparing a vocal or instrumental solo.



At the November Council Meetings

Joint Council:

- ➤ Because the old plan no longer applies to Pastor's insurance plan, a new plan for 2017 was approved at a total pretax cost of \$900 per congregation.
- ➤ The CD/DVD drive on Pastor's laptop was replaced by Brian Tulley.
- ➤ The worship committee reviewed all upcoming worship services.
- Next Worship Committee meeting will be held on December 14 at 6PM at Faith during the Advent supper.
- > Approximately 50 people attended the parish pancake breakfast on Reformation Sunday.
- ➤ The Thanksgiving Supper is organized and will be held after the 5PM worship on November 20.
- ➤ Children's Christmas program will be at 10:30AM on December 18 at Faith Church.
- ➤ Sunday School and Adult Class will not meet on December 25 or January 1.
- ➤ The new copier will be installed on November 14 with Jeannene, Jane Runaas and Pastor receiving training.
- ➤ Jeannene Bousselot announced her retirement as of May 28, 2017. She has served as Parish Secretary since 1988. She will outline a list of duties and assist in training the new secretary. The Parish Coordinating Committee will draft a job description and candidate qualifications. The goal is to fill the position by March or April 2017.
- An invitation and announcement of the Thanksgiving worship will be placed in *The Observer* at a total cost of \$79.90.
- ➤ Donations for the Advent meals will be given to the Carroll Assistance Center.
- November 30 and December 7 Advent meals will be hosted by Our Savior's; December 14 meal will be hosted by the God Squad at Faith Church and December 21 meal will be hosted by Faith Church.
- Next meeting will be held on December 15, 2016 at Our Savior's at 7:00PM.

Faith Council:

- Financial reports were approved with a designated balance of \$1,445.97 and a working balance of \$42,959.80.
 - Brian Tulley presented a quote from

Window World to replace entire window system above the entry doors. This would include metal supports with 12 panes - the upper 6 are plain glass and the lower 6 would be tempered glass. Metal work would match doors. A second quote will be sought from another source. The altar windows also need to be caulked. Both jobs would be scheduled for February or March of 2017.

- ➤ Keith Gasper will be contacted about the replacement of an element in a refrigerator in the church kitchen.
- ➤ The parsonage siding project is nearing the installment date per the contractor's schedule.

Our Savior's Council:

- Approved financial reports with a balance of \$2,648.28.
- New batteries were put in the wireless microphone and it is working. The foam on the headset may need to be replaced.
- The purchase of a weed trimmer will be postponed until spring.
- Sign-up sheets will be passed to serve the November 30 and December 7 Advent meals.
