Pastor's View

Three and most important is how God touches us and makes us the church.

Do you want your church? (By Fredrick Schmidt)

When I went to seminary in the seventies, the church was a given. ... That isn't the case any longer. Most congregations, regardless of their size need to be asking themselves questions about the future. But the most important question is, "Do you want your church?"

The answer to that question will probably depend upon what you think "your church" is.

For far too many, the answer is often that it is a place that my needs are met. It's not uncommon for people to say that they have chosen a church because it had a program for their children or that the church had an outstanding music program, that the time of the services fit with their lives, or that they liked the preaching. To put it crassly, some people treat the church as an end-user of a product. ...

But a better way of defining church, apart from the all important definition of it as "the body of Christ," is to ask ourselves, "Where can I be available for the work of Christ in the world?" — because it's not all about us, about our needs, or about the needs of our families. The church is a living extension of the work of Christ and is meant to be a living, breathing embodiment of Christ's love in the world that draws and embraces a broken world.

As an end user, the answer to — "Do you want your church?" — is always conditional and it can be answered by asking the question, "What is it doing for me now?" For the Christians who have sought out a community where they can be the living, breathing embodiment of Christ's love in the world, the answer is always "yes."

That's not a question your minister can answer for you, but the future of your church depends upon it.

Ministry in the Future

Rev. Dr. Craig Nessan will be at Faith Lutheran Church on Tuesday, September 19, at 7:00 p.m. to help us discuss the pastoral leadership options that were outlined in last month's newsletter and again below. It is important for all members of Faith and Our Savior's to attend this meeting and be part of the planning for the future of ordained ministry in this parish.

There is already a shortage of Lutheran pastors in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). In the ELCA, there is an expected shortage of 1,000 pastors in the next 2-3 years. In the next 10 years there will be over 2,000 openings for pastors.

How will this affect the Calamus Lutheran Parish? I have been looking into this concern. When I retire, I want the parish to have or be working on a solution to pastoral leadership. What are some choices right now?

- 1. Calamus Parish becomes part of a "Geographic Parish." This is where 2-5 congregations come together to share a pastor and another certified person. This Geographic Parish model could include other denominations that are in fellowship with the ELCA.
- 2. Calamus Parish supports an "M.Div. Collaborative Learning Program" with a person who wants to become a pastor in the ELCA. This person (from our congregation or another congregation) will serve as a "student-pastor" during the four years of academic online studies. The advantages for the "student-pastor" are: reduced student loans, real-time classroom participation, two campus workshops per year, and site congregational leadership. Calamus Parish becomes a teaching congregation; similar to an intern site. Candidates for the Collaborative Learning Program are nominated by their synods and approved by the ELCA.

3. Calamus Parish uses the "Theological Education for Emerging Ministries" (TEEM) style. The TEEM program provides preparation for those who will provide pastoral ministry in emerging ministry contexts including inner city, multicultural, rural, and other communities. Candidates for the TEEM program are supported by their community and will complete a two-year program with Wartburg Seminary. Candidates for the TEEM program are nominated by their synods and approved by the ELCA. Normally TEEM candidates are age 40 or older.

The point of repeating this long explanation is that joint council will be considering these choices. When the joint council makes a choice, they will take the next step in reaching the goal of having pastoral leadership for Calamus Parish in the coming years. The council and I will work with the Synod during this process. Please pray about our future. Please pray about our ministry. Please come to this important meeting with your questions.



Cremation Service for Old Religious Items




