Pastor Writes

Thanksgiving was over, even if only just a few short days prior. But already, we were fullsteam-ahead for Christmas (how does that happen?). The boys were singing Christmas songs they were practicing for their school program. They were jumping up and down, wondering when we were going to put our tree up. They were tearing around in the Santa hats I had just bought and hadn't had a single second to stash away yet. So, in a desperate effort to buy a little quiet time, I suggested they sit down at the kitchen table and write out their Christmas lists. They looked at me like I was Einstein...they grabbed paper and pencils and scooted their chairs together and leaned in close, so that their whispers were understandable only to each other. They were a three-headed creature, looking quite Suess-like from the back, what with the three Santa hats and all.

As I put groceries away, I heard them laugh and giggle as they made their lists, spelling words out for each other and helping Philip with his alphabet. Finally, their lists were complete. They held them up to the light, inspecting them like da Vinci might have the Mona Lisa. Satisfied, they scurried off to wage war on the neighbor boys, pulling on hats and gloves and coats, forgetting their Santa hats, which gave them a decidedly less fierce appearance. As they scooted out the door, Christian threw this question at me, "Mom, what do you want for Christmas?"

Without thinking, I said, "Just one day when you boys don't fight."

He stopped dead in his tracks, and the two others plowed into him.

"Hey, what's the big idea?" Jacob whined (in his best nasal-y, Little Rascals voice)... "get goin!"

"Boys," Christian declared with the grave authority of a 5-star General, "did you hear what Mom just said? Did you hear what she said she wanted for Christmas?"

"No," the younger two chorused.

This only confirmed my suspicion that I am never, ever listened to. Ever.

"She says for Christmas, she wants us to have one full day without fighting."

The younger two looked at him like he just landed from outer space. And then they swung their faces around to look at me, like I had just landed from outer space.

"We're gonna have to talk about this, Mom," Christian said, "C'mon, boys, let's move out."

I watched them march outside and climb the big evergreen that stands in the middle of the yard, where they proceeded to hold their Great Conference. For the boys in the neighborhood, this great big tree is where all Great Conferences are held. The tree can easily hold 14 or 15 boys, all holding a Great Conference, and you'd never even know it by just looking at the tree.

A half an hour later, the three came back in, looking grim.

Jacob spoke first.

"We can't do it, Mom, but we'll get you anything else you want. *Anything*."

I laughed out loud—how could you not?—because the boys could not grasp the truth of the situation, the Big Truth, that is to say, that God asks the same of us, to simply love one another, and God christens it with the arrival of the Prince of Peace, his very own Son, and our reaction is the same one as the boys, "We can't do it God, we just can't do it."

But the grace comes not in empty promises...nor does it come in unrealistic expectations...the grace comes into the picture when we say the words, "We'll try" (which is what the boys ended up promising, and I think they meant it in earnest) when God knows we will try, and knows better that we will fail, and loves us all the more...which is grace by definition.

Maybe God knows we will never be able to give him what he fully desires from us-selfless love and compassionate peace...after all, if we were able to give God these things on our own, there would be no need for Jesus. But maybe, while we await the return of the Christ child, maybe we can give God the gift of peace—not forever, or even for a long time—but maybe for a moment or two, however fleeting. And maybe, just maybe, as God watches us march from our Great Conferences to the wars we wage on our neighbors, God might take delight in our naiveté as we try our best for a moment of peace from time to time, and this attempt just might make God smile for that fleeting moment or two, and maybe that fleeting smile is the best that we can do, and maybe, just maybe, in God's eyes, that fleeting smile for those fleeting moments is enough.

Such is Christmas wonder—infinite love and patience from the One who knows our failures and our limitations even better than we ourselves do...and who still manages to laugh at us, because we look so very ridiculous running around in our Santa hats.

Our Savior's Council:


➤ Financial reports were accepted with a balance of \$49.80;

Home Delivered Meals to Over-55 Citizens

Generations Area Agency on Aging, as a part of the Federal Older Americans Act Nutrition Program will provide a home-delivered meal to meet the nutritional needs of seniors. Special diets are available upon request, with a prescription from your doctor. Meals are packaged and sent from Sodexo Food Service located at St. Ambrose University, Davenport, Iowa.

Most of the time, meals will be delivered hot and ready to eat for lunch. However, there may be a time when you need to warm your meal slightly.

At the end of each month you will receive a statement for the number of meals you have received with a request for a suggested donation of \$3.25 per meal – the actual cost of the meal is \$7.71. Individual donations are encouraged by anyone to help with the cost. You may send checks to: Davenport Office Generations, 935 East 53rd Street, Davenport, Iowa 52807.


