Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Since Easter is late this year, we get to spend a little longer than usual in this church season of "the Time After Epiphany." The day of Epiphany, January 6th, celebrates the day that the three wise men or Magi visited the Christ-child, and we then remain in this "Time After Epiphany" until Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. The visit of the Magi to the Christ-child is significant because from the earliest days of Jesus's life we see that Jesus is not just meant to be a savior for the Jewish people. Jesus is going to be a savior for the whole world and God's kingdom in Jesus shall include all the ends of the earth.

We get to contemplate in the days from Epiphany until Ash Wednesday how Jesus is still showing up in unexpected ways in our world today. In each Sunday's texts, we get to ask ourselves the question "What does this reveal to us about who Jesus is?" As humans we are prone to placing God in a box. We do this to try and better understand God, but we start to get into trouble when we think that our box and way of understanding God is the only box that exists. The reality is that God is always bigger and more loving and more forgiving towards others (and our own selves) than we imagine.

In this month of February, before we begin Lent, I would invite us to contemplate together where are the unexpected places we see God showing up, and how is God calling us as a community and as individuals to love others and ourselves more deeply. I pray that this noticing would lead us to further awe and wonder at how God is moving in God's world. I pray that this noticing would lead us to faithful steps to love and serve as God has first loved and served us. I pray that we will always be willing to let God breakdown the boxes we try and fit God into.

Where is God unexpectedly showing up? How are we being called to love more deeply? Happy noticing and discerning dear siblings.

Education Committee

- ➤ Decided to send the \$560 remaining in the Sunday School account at Faith (2016-2021) to ELCA Good Gifts (for girls to attend school).
- ➤ Sunday School offering of \$247 in 2024 will go to the same place as the 2024 Noisy Offering (C-W Schools).
- > Distributed the Sunday School lesson schedule for the remainder of the year.
- May 11 will be the last day of Sunday School.
- ➤ Will consider using *Connect* curriculum in the future with older Sunday School students.
- > Evaluated the Christmas program.
- Discussed Bible School.
- > Seeking additional volunteers to serve on the education committee.

Worship Committee

- ➤ Evaluated "Hanging of the Greens" service; Of the Land & Seasons liturgy used at midweek Advent services, both Christmas services, and the two "Lessons and Carols" services.
