Dear Siblings in Christ,

One of the things I most enjoy about our adult class on Sunday mornings is the variety of ideas and questions that we explore together. There are no questions unworthy of being asked! Lately we have been studying together the history of the Bible, how we got it, and just what is going on in this living Word of God that we get to study. As a part of our discussion, we noted that we don't spend a lot of time with our Old Testament texts on Sundays. They are typically read, and then we move on without always knowing what is happening in them. I think many of us, if pressed, would admit that our knowledge about the Old Testament is not our strong suit, in terms of our Bible knowledge.

I was asked to preach on these texts a bit more in order to increase familiarity with these stories, and I really appreciated this ask and challenge! Therefore, during Lent, we will be focusing on our Old Testament texts (hint, hint for confirmation students taking sermon notes, the preaching text will be the first reading). As Christians we trust that while Jesus was not present in human form at the time of the Old Testament, he was still indeed the Word through whom all things were created. As Christians, we trust that the entire Bible preaches Christ crucified and risen for the sake of the world.

I hope we will enjoy and learn a lot together taking the time this Lent to explore via preaching and teaching our Old Testament texts further. I hope that we will experience in a new way God's living Word for us and the world. And I hope that we will gain some new or further refined appreciation for our Old Testament texts.

I look forward to hearing your thoughts and reaction and insights on this throughout Lent! I am grateful to our adult class that encouraged this! Please know that I always welcome thoughts and feedback on worship and preaching.

The **Christian Outreach Committee** works to provide an opportunity for the church to connect with the community. Our projects for 2025 are similar to the ones completed in 2024. In January, we collected coats, hats, and gloves which were given to the Carroll Assistance Center in Wheatland.

The committee will seek donations of peanut butter during the Lenten season. We will provide food for the meal following Bible School and freezer pops for the Cal-Wheat students who work during the annual school clean-up day.

During the summer months, the committee plans to assemble health kits for those in need. We had an enjoyable evening running the concession stand at the school during ball season and will offer our services again this season. Coffee and donuts will be provided before the worship in the park in August.

We will continue to organize "Feeding the Children" during the school year. The program serves seven Cal-Wheat students needing food for the weekend.

In November, we will host a pie and ice cream fellowship gathering following the Sunday evening Thanksgiving celebration. Then in December coats, hats, and gloves will again be collected.

The committee is always looking for new ideas and willing helpers.

In February, fifteen council and committee members from Calamus Lutheran Parish gathered for the yearly retreat. Goals from the year 2024 were reviewed: 1) Connecting with our Lutheran and ecumenical partners around us, 2) Assisting with events in the community, 3) A monthly lunch get-together at Buck's Corner, 4) A monthly committee highlight in the newsletter, 5) Events that invite the community, 6) Focusing on being intentional beyond our walls, 7) The 2024 Noisy Offering going to the Cal-Wheat Elementary School.

The group felt the parish had executed those goals well, but that there was room to further connect with partners in our community. We are grateful to many who have facilitated the goals happening, especially our committees and the God Squad.

Plans for 2025 are to continue support of the community through activities done in 2024. We are also hoping to begin using fabric that has been stored at the churches, by asking people to cut fabric into squares (no sewing required!), looking into other causes we can collect for, and to begin regular gatherings of the young adults and parents of our parish. The 2025 Noisy Offering will go to support Lutheran Disaster Response.

In 2025, the Noisy Offering will be supporting **Lutheran Disaster Response**. Lutheran Disaster Response collaborates with other disaster response organizations and religious entities in the U.S. and around the world.

Lutheran Disaster Response strives to help the church continue to be church in the midst of disaster; following Christ's call to share hope and healing with our neighbor in need.

Some key areas of work include:

- Providing emotional and spiritual care of people who have been affected by a disaster and for leaders who respond to a disaster.
- Coordinating volunteers through our local affiliates. Assisting refugees in a holistic way by meeting the varied needs of the community.
- Promoting disaster risk-reduction by helping communities build their assets thereby reducing the effects of likely disasters.
- Providing long-term recovery efforts by addressing the unmet needs months or even years after a disaster strikes.
