August 2025 Pastor's View

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Over the past few weeks, I have heard from many of us about how hard it is to watch the news these days. There is a lot going on and watching and hearing about what is occurring in our country and in our world can be painful, confusing, and just downright exhausting. If you are like me, you often have two modes of operation in this scenario: (1) watch and read anything and everything, or (2) feel too overwhelmed and just shut it all off and down, and distract myself so that I don't have to think about it. I would like to suggest that neither of these extremes is helpful or even all that healthy. However, it seems to be the pattern I very often find myself in.

The question often seems to be "what do we do." How do we navigate staying informed without giving into despair? And what is our response as followers of Jesus? While I will never pretend to have all the answers, what I feel very confident in saying is that throughout the Bible we see how Jesus moves towards the pain, but he also takes time away to pray and reset. One of the freedoms we experience in the Gospel is the freedom to imperfectly do the same. As followers of Jesus who are free from the fear and power of sin and death, we do not have to fear moving towards the pain and suffering of others and being the Body of Christ with our time, gifts, and treasures to those who are hurting. However, we have finite abilities. We need to rest and reconnect and pray and be strengthened by Jesus, to let others be the Body of Christ to us as well.

I think it is helpful for us to remember that when Jesus performed miracles or cured and healed people, he did not fix everything in their lives instantaneously. The people who were fed at the feeding of the 5,000 were still food insecure later that week. The people whom Jesus healed still got sick or injured later in life, and they also died one day. Many of the disciples became martyrs. All of the people Jesus encountered and touched still had to live with the realities of Roman occupation. The presence and power of Jesus, the freedom of the Gospel, does not fix everything instantly, but it always creates deeper community and connection, it tangibly reminds that no one is ever alone, and it gives hope that God is here, moving among us, constantly drawing all people and creation closer to God's self.

So, when the news and worldly happenings feel and are overwhelming, we rely on Jesus. We rely on Jesus to help us not shy away from the pain of the world, but to instead show up as the Body of Christ, and we rely on Jesus to renew and restore us in community. Jesus sees and knows the heaviness each of us feels, and Jesus is with you in it. Strengthening you to be the Body of Christ together for the sake of the world that God so loves, and renewing and restoring you together because God so loves you.
